## New Gunshot Residue Collection Kits (GSR Kits)

The Georgia Bureau of Investigation Division of Forensic Science (GBI-DOFS) has awarded a new contract to TRITECHFORENSICS (previously Tri-Tech Inc.) to produce an updated GSR collection kit approved for submission to the GBI Crime Laboratory. The new kits, **GSR-SEM(Q)GBI**, will replace the collection kits previously manufactured by Tri-Tech Inc. (**GSR-AA/SEM(Q)GBI**) as the approved kit of the GBI-DOFS. As of this date, agencies should no longer purchase the older Tri-Tech kit, or any other non-approved kits. **The current GBI approved kit should be purchased from TRITECHFORENSICS** (1-800-438-7884 or <u>www.tritechforensics.com</u>) using the order number **GSR-SEM(Q)GBI**.

The configuration of these new kits will allow for a decreased collection time, as the cotton tipped swabs have been eliminated and are no longer utilized. Changes have also been made to the enclosed information form to be completed by your agency.

We encourage you to begin using the new TRITECHFORENSICS kit immediately; however, any old Tri-Tech kits submitted will still be accepted. GBI-DOFS will not perform GSR analysis on any collection kit other than the approved Tri-Tech GSR-AA/SEM(Q)GBI (old kit) or TRITECHFORENSICS GSR-SEM(Q)GBI (new kit).

## **Gunshot Residue Analysis Operation Policy Review**

The presence of gunshot residue (GSR) on a person's hands indicates that a person has fired a weapon, come into contact with a firearm or has been in the presence of a firearm during discharge. The absence of GSR residue on a person's hands is not conclusive proof that the individual did not fire a weapon or was not in close proximity to a discharged firearm. GSR examinations cannot distinguish between discharging a firearm and being in close proximity to a weapon when it is discharged.

GSR analysis will not be routinely conducted on kits collected from gunshot victims, including cases of suspected suicide OR from kits collected from sources other than the hands of a suspected shooter (e.g. clothing).
